

Marie Maxey Foundation Annual Report for 2023

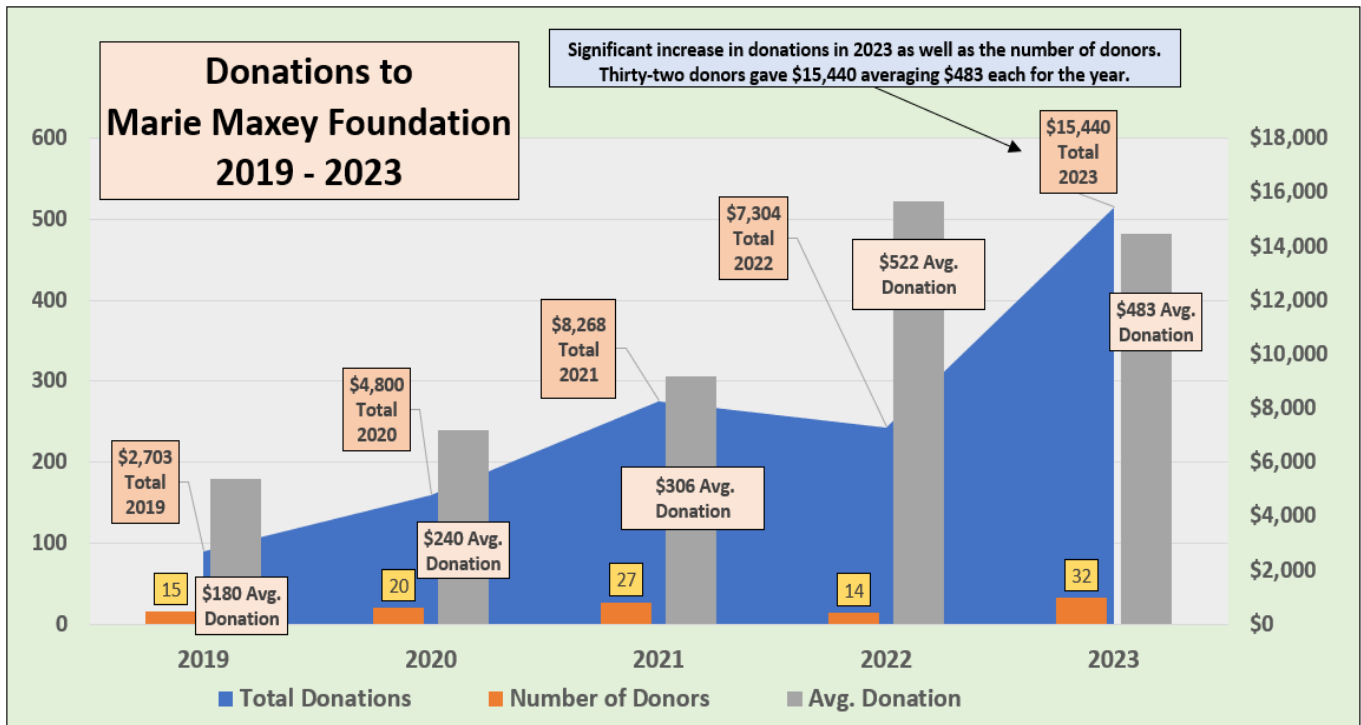

In 2023, we provided \$11,000 in scholarships and \$4,400 in support of health activities and Arab women's livelihoods, and the purchase of a Spanish-language Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

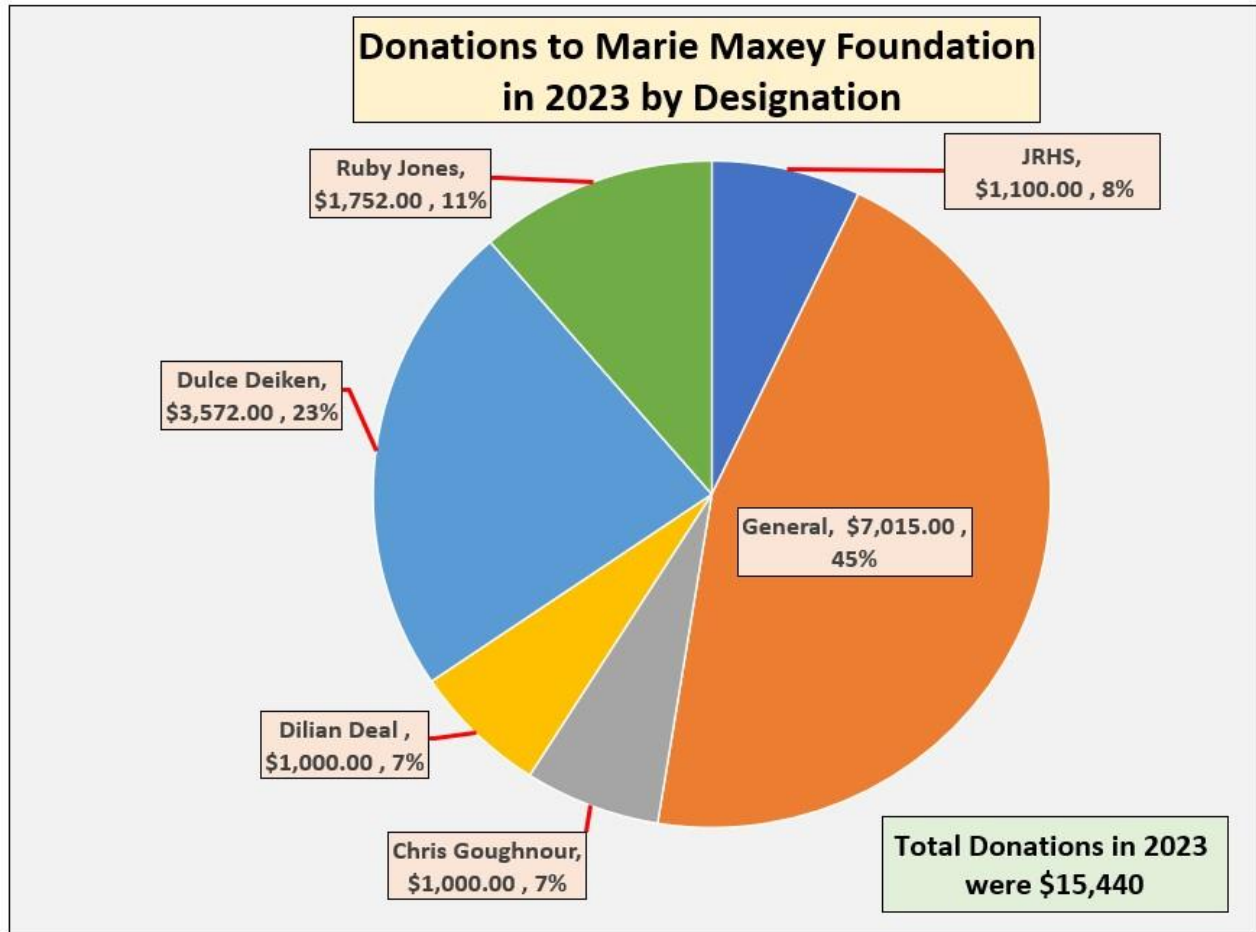
Administrative expenses were \$820, or **five percent** of total expenditures of \$16,220, with 30% of those costs for website maintenance and 70% for fundraising postage and mailings.

A significant increase in the donations to our foundation allowed us to increase our grants and activities by over 100 percent. In 2023, we gave scholarships and financed community activities totaling \$15,400.

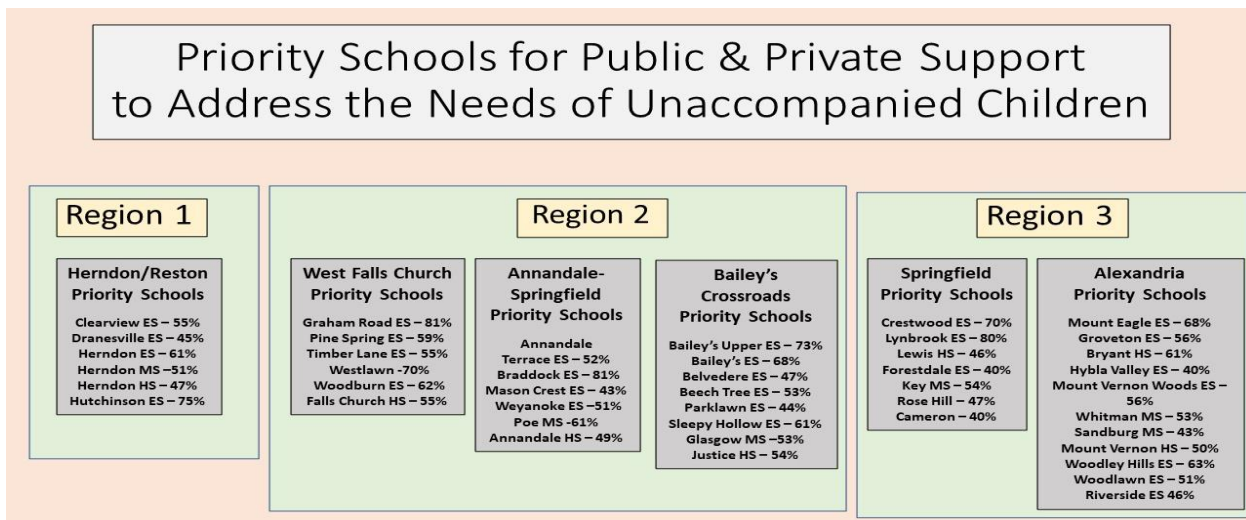

Treasurer’s Report – The 12/31/2023 balance in the foundation bank account was \$2,841. Total expenditures and liabilities for 2023 amounted to \$16,220, while total donations to the foundation from our donors during the same period amounted to \$15,400. Administrative expenses totaled \$820, with \$270 used for website subscription and domain rental and \$550 for cards, stamps, and paper for fundraising mailings. The costs of two breakfast meetings with donors are included in the \$550 cost of fundraising – breakfasts at Silver Diner (\$51.85) and Denny’s (\$25.90). A private message will be sent to board members with a link to the foundation’s bank statements for 2023. In the bank statements, \$50 a month is paid to the Virginia 529 college fund in the name of the foundation for January through August, totaling \$400. The foundation intended to use the 529 funds for future scholarships, but the guidance on how to do that is unclear and could result in difficulty in awarding future scholarships. The board is requested to approve the cancellation of the 529 and to revert the \$400 to our general fund. Note: Christmas fundraising for 2023 resulted in more than \$4,000 in donations, and along with donations in January 2024, the current balance of the foundation bank account is \$7,053.

Proposed Activities for 2024

Scholarship Program – Scholarships will be provided to Latino youth in Fairfax County public schools. Target schools are listed below. They were identified in our analysis of the placement of Unaccompanied Youth in Fairfax County, Virginia. See <https://www.maxey.info/helping-unaccompanied-children>.



Mentoring Program – Using this same list of priority schools, we want to try to help more youth obtain a part-time job, gain budgeting and money management skills, and plan for a better future. The efforts will go beyond Bryant High School. We have already started meeting with other mentoring programs to learn what they are doing and to determine how we can create synergy to have a more significant impact.

Healthcare Program – We plan a trip to Honduras at the end of June 2024 to continue with a preventative healthcare initiative. We have shipped medical equipment and training material to Honduras. We will work with local clinics to design a public health outreach program to identify and treat high blood pressure. We are also taking a state-of-the-art Spanish-language AED (defibrillator) and training equipment so that a unit can be maintained in San Luis, Santa Barbara, Honduras, to treat heart attack victims.

Ambassador Larry L. Palmer
July 13, 1949 – April 22, 2021



The Honorable Ambassador Larry L. Palmer was born in Augusta, Georgia, on July 13, 1949. He had a distinguished career with the U.S. Department of State, serving as the ambassador to Honduras (2002 – 2005) and Barbados (2012 – 2016). He was a dedicated and compassionate leader who understood the importance of promoting stability and broad-based economic growth. His efforts ensured the successful investment of over \$250 million by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) and the Millennium Challenge Corporation in Central America and the Caribbean. During his tenure as Chief Executive Officer of the Inter-American Foundation (2005 – 2010), Ambassador Palmer guided a team of development professionals in successfully implementing education, healthcare, and economic development projects. In retirement, Ambassador Palmer helped train Foreign Service Officers on the importance of maintaining security overseas as a senior instructor at the Foreign Affairs Counter-Threat (FACT) course. His last initiative as Ambassador in Residence at Howard University took him back to one of his true loves – working with young people and helping them shape their future. Ambassador Palmer passed away on April 22, 2021.

Lindsey Neal, an International Studies major at Bluefield State University (BSU), a Historically Black College and University (HBCU), was awarded the 2023 Ambassador Larry Palmer Memorial Scholarship on September 23, 2023. Conn-Weld Industries provided matching funding with the Marie Maxey Foundation for a \$1,000 scholarship.

Ms. Neal is an Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority member and Vice President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, International Studies Ambassador, Secretary of the International Student Organization, and a student-athlete for Bluefield State's Volleyball team. Throughout high school, Lindsey maintained a 4.0 GPA and has sustained a 3.6 GPA at BSU. Lindsey is enrolled at BSU in the International Studies program with a minor in Psychology. After earning her bachelor's degree, Lindsey plans to attend Law School. Her career goal is to work in international justice or as a member of the Foreign Service: "I hope to serve as either an International Judge or U.S. Ambassador."

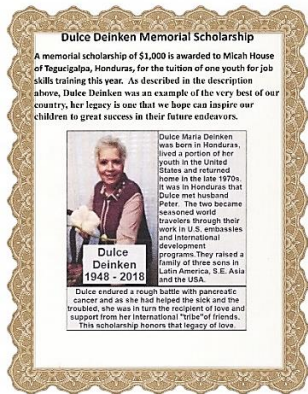
The Ruby Carpenter Jones family raised over \$1,600 for an outreach program for Bedouin Arab

women in North Africa. We are sharing a sample of their weaving with our donors. We provided Woven with Hope an initial grant of \$1,000 and ordered \$500 of their weavings. We plan to continue supporting this group as they improve the lives of Arab women.



Chris Goughnour was born in Brazil and lived with his U.S. foreign service family in several countries prior to graduating from high school and moving to the United States. As a dual U.S.-Brazilian citizen, Chris cherished his international background, but also took enormous pride in serving the United States in both the U.S. Navy --and after college-- as a highly decorated U.S. Army Ranger stationed in Afghanistan. Chris was taken from this world in 2018, having suffered a heart attack while pursuing one of his greatest passions, deep-water diving. His memory lives on in his parents, wife and two children, brothers, and comrades in arms.

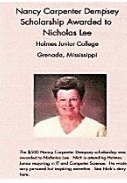
